Holy Rosary will be celebrating its 60th anniversary this year! And you are invited to two exciting events to celebrate this special milestone.

Founded in 1954, Holy Rosary School opened its doors in Sept. with four classrooms and a cafeteria. The school had six grades and 170 students that were taught by the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth, Kentucky. The school grew rapidly under the direction of Fr. J. William Wiley, first pastor of Holy Rosary Parish and Sr. Sheila

Four additional classrooms were added to the original building in 1956. Four more were added in 1958, and in 1960, the third addition was made to the school consisting of a separate building of eight classrooms, a library media center, computer laboratory, Science lab, music room, art room, gym, a Girl Scout and Boy Scout room, cafeteria, guidance office, a resource room, and administrative offices. In 2010, Holy Rosary completed its latest addition consisting of new church offices, a meeting room, and a second gym.

The first celebration will be a 60th Anniversary Party which will be held on Sat. 09/13, beginning with Mass at 4 pm.
